Arrangements Complete for Seventh Annual Tourney

The Capitol Bowl has been chosen as the official tournament lane, with 14 beautiful Brunswick automatic lanes awaiting the Jednota bowlers to post their high scores, which is located in the heart of the city at 219-221 South Washington Street, just one block from Hotel Owaso.

Hotel Owaso has been designated as official tournament headquarters, which is two blocks north of the Capitol Club, and is the hub of entertainment and good food for all Jednota bowlers and their guests. The Hotel Owaso is located on the main corner of South Washington and Main Streets, with its parking area just around the corner of the hotel and is diagonally from the Capitol Bowl. The hotel will accommodate all bowlers and for reservations, write to Peter Mra, 145 Elizabeth Drive, Owaso, Michigan or phone SA 5-7338. Let's get your reservations in early and eliminate all confusion. The motel is just a 5-minute drive from the city which are also available. All rooms at the hotel are with bath and showers, ranging in price from \$3.00 to \$9.00.

The Branch 756 Home Committee extends pickup service to all Jednotars who are planning to try it, with Fleet, Michigan Airport being the point of pickup. All they ask is that they be notified as to the number at the flight date and time of arrival. Have your flight scheduled in Flint, Michigan, as it is the closest to Owaso, Michigan.

Owaso, Michigan Branch 756 is playing host to the Seventh Annual Jednota Tournament and the hub of the tournament, an important will center at the Capitol Club, 204 North Washington Street. Arrangements have been made to entertain all participants in good wholesome Slovak atmosphere. There will be good old fashioned Slovak meals available plus refreshments and entertainment. Our Owaso Jednota brothers are looking forward to meeting all our Jednota participants and their guests. We can say that they will do all possible to give you a weekend to remember.

The tournament committee would like to remind all bowler that our tenpin is open to all bona fide Jednota male members in good standing. We have a moral support ABC function this utilizes all ABC members to the special awards granted by the ABC for high scores and games. Anyone not having an ABC membership card may purchase it at the lanes, prior to their participation at the current rate.

In order to make the competition equal, our tournament is naturally handicapped. The handicap is based on two-thirds of the difference between your highest 1950-1960 league average, if at least twelve games and 200. For all the new bowlers who do not have an average for the 1950-1960 season a provision has been made to use your highest league average of at least twelve games as the basis for the first five places in each event. This estimate is based on a sixty team entry, so if we have more than sixty teams entered, these figures will probably increase considerably. Remember, total prize money will be well over \$2,000.00. This year the First Catholic Slovak Union will donate \$250.00 for every team entered in the tournament which will increase the prize money, instead of last year's donation which was \$600.00. So feel free, you can surely make this tournament much richer by entering your team entries. 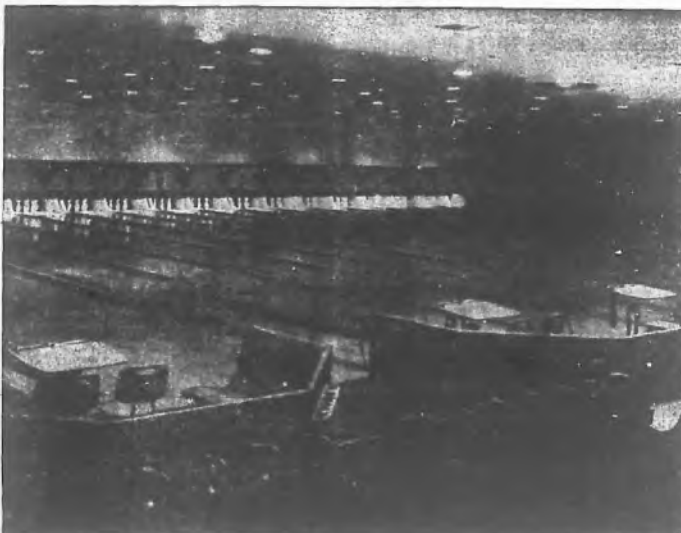

As it is the past years the First Catholic Slovak Union has donated \$500.00 prizes prize money plus trophies, but with the beginning of the 1961 Jednota tournaments, the prize money donation will be changed to \$150.00 per team with the following rule: As you increase the entries, the donations also increase accordingly. If the number shows a decrease in the team entries, the donation will decrease likewise. With this system the prize list shown on this page will change according to the entries and you will find it worth your while to attend and compete for this entry of prize. Considered the new of the Jednota Tenpin Tournament in comparison to other tournaments, the First Catholic Slovak Union has taken the lead in prize amounts, that is comparing the tournaments with the same amount of participation.

I am very grateful to the Athletic Committee and the Board of Directors for adopting such a plan which motivates their love and confidence in the upcoming popular game of bowling. We have not received thanks from all the participants and our wishes, efforts and goal be that the Jednota, will rise, grow at a rapid pace in the coming year.

As you can see, we have steadily grown through the years, starting with our 24-team entry in Youngstown, Ohio, in 1953, to our 66-team entry in the Barberton, Ohio tournament. We have dropped in the 1960 Allentown, Pa. tournament but we also have faced a recession year and holding a 62-team entry was doing fine. We have set our sights on an 80-team entry at the 1961 Owaso, Michigan area and the know that with your love of the sport this goal should be attained. Remember with the 66-team entry your prize money will be greater and who can't live the money those days play a golf weekend among your Jednota Brother bowlers, so with a little more effort and exertion as all concerned let us attain our goal and show our gratitude to the First Catholic Slovak Union for its confidence that they have put in us.

We have an 80 team from the Youngstown Jednota Union, 10 teams from Branch 553 in Akron, Ohio, who as always are greatly attended, 10 teams from Branch 206 Ford City, Pa., another bowler year and incidentally top prize team, Cleveland's three Funks with their consistent seven in eight entries, East Pittsburgh's Pa. with one, Zikora, Heceta, Pa. and Mickey Walters' gang two, Barberton, Ohio with two, Brother Gresh's boys from Shadokan, Pa., with one or two entries, East and Pennsylvania who have opened their eyes to the prize to be well represented, Marshall, Pa., who last year were led by Brother Frank Novotny, Whiting, Indiana, who make their first appearance with three to four teams, Bradford, Pa., who made their appearance in the 1960 tourney for the first time since changing over from ducks, Brother Michael J. Zahorsky with his two teams from West Allentown, Pa., Brother Straka from Shadokan, Pa., with his squad and including our Supreme Advocate Brother Edward Kerpel's Owaso area for new team entries, and not by passing the boys from Lorain, Ohio, with their fine array of bowlers. We are looking for districts and areas that we have not as yet reached and have high hopes that this year is the year. From the Michigan area we have in the neighborhood of 20 entries and over.

We sincerely believe that the Seventh Annual Jednota Tenpin Tournament will surpass all previous records. Let's all make sure that our city or branch is well represented. Get a team together. If your area is small, then come out and bowl the doubles and singles events. Remember, the greater the number of entries, the larger the prize. Don't forget that entries close on March 15, 1961, so if you want to be listed in the program book, get busy and get that entry in immediately.

Owaso the Friendly City

Owaso, Michigan, is the largest city in Shiawassee County, and is geographically the center of the State of Michigan. Owaso is only 24 miles west of Flint and 85 miles northwest of Detroit.

The 1958 census showed Owaso had a population of over 18,000.

The city's name, Owaso, was derived from a famous Chippewa Indian Christian named "Wasa." It has many beautifully wide tree-lined streets and shows that thoughtful planning was given by its founders back in the year 1850.

Owaso is easily accessible by rail, air and modern highways. The Ann Arbor, the Grand Trunk, and the Michigan Central serve this city by rail. State Routes 21 and 47 cross Owaso at right angles making it accessible from all directions by car.

If you are traveling by way of the Ohio Turnpike, you can get off at the No. 4 Maumee Exit and take Route 23 North, which is an excellent highway and make connections with Route No. 21 just outside of Flint, Michigan. Turn left on Route No. 21 and you are only 20 miles from Owaso.

Owaso has two Catholic churches, one of which is a Slovak parish. A large Slovak community is looking forward to meeting all Jednota participants. Times of Masses for Sunday will be posted on the Bulletin Board at the bowling lanes with directions from the hotel also available.

We know that the local committee is making arrangements to guarantee everyone attending a grand time which will be long remembered. We know that a bowling ball will be awarded to the lucky Jednota participant who will be the holder of the door prize ticket which will be drawn on the last weekend. A certificate will be mailed to the lucky winner and if you are not present, it will be mailed to you at your home. This is made possible by the St. Joseph Branch 736, our tournament host. They will also give you a souvenir which will bring you memories as the years go by.
