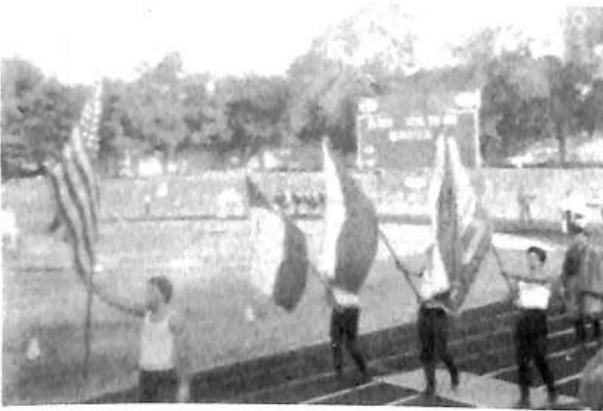

The American Sokol Organization Educational Committee is conducting an **ESSAY CONTEST** for JUNIORS and SENIORS.

The contest will run from July 1, 1981 and entries are to be postmarked no later than September 1, 1981. Prizes will be awarded in each division and souvenir mementoes will be sent to each contestant. All entries will become the property of the American Sokol Organization Educational Committee and none will be returned. The decision of the judges is final.

Following are the complete rules. Please see to it that every member of your administrative body and in your gym classes is fully aware of them through your lectures, newsletter and bulletin boards. All Sokol members are eligible to enter, who attended and/or participated in the XV Slet. The members of the American Sokol Educational Committee and the judges we have selected are exceptions.

### Divisions:

**Junior (13-18 years) Seniors (18 years and over)**

**500 WORDS:** My Recollections of the XV American Sokol Slet, as a participant or as a spectator.

### RULES:

1. Entries may be written either in English or Czech.

2. Entries will be judged on:

A. Neatness

All entries must be typed or in legible handwriting, in ink. All typewritten entries must be double-spaced. All entries must be on one side of the paper.

B. Originality, content and clarity of thought.

C. Preciseness

1. Dates, names and locations must be used correctly.

2. Spelling, punctuation and grammar must be correct.

D. Originality

1. All entries must be personally written and constructed.

2. Any essay will be eliminated if found to be copies of other works.

3. Quotations or direct references that are used must be indexed as to source at the end of the essay.

4. Integrity and honesty are to be emphasized in the entrance of the contest.

### REQUIREMENTS OF CONTESTANTS:

1. If under 18 years of age, should have participated in Slet '81 and be a regular member of the class.

2. If over 18 years of age, must be a member of the unit and participant or spectator of Slet '81.

3. Members of the American Sokol Organization Educational Committee and judges are not eligible to enter.

### REQUIREMENTS OF ENTERING AND WRITING THE ESSAY:

1. On the left hand side of paper, at the top:

1st line: Last name first, followed by full first name (no initials)

2nd line: Full street address

3rd line: City, State, Zip code

4th line: State JUNIOR or SENIOR

5th line: Name of Unit and District

2. All essays must begin with the title and at least two and one-half inches from the top of the page.

If more than one page is used, they MUST be numbered and stapled on the right hand corner.

## Our Flying Czechs

For Grandma, watching 30 children performing out on the gym floor, there is only little Vera.

"Watch my cartwheels, Babičko, watch me!"

Vera's rubber-ball body bounces all over the mat. Her straight, dark hair flying in all directions, she takes on the balance beam, parallel bars, rings - tumbling, vaulting - and she's only three. Leaping, rolling, stretching, she's showing off only for Grandma.

For Grandma, it's a lot more.

This is Sokol.

Worried, harassed men organized Sokol to outwit the harsh Hapsburg regime in 1862 in Czechoslovakia. The Hapsburgs forbade public and political gatherings. But a few people working out on gym bars seemed harmless enough.

Through generations, Czechs suffered successive waves of oppressors who tried to divide them or conquer them. Sokol continued as the device for meeting and maintaining unity - socially, politically and culturally. Members wore a silent signal, a falcon feather in their hats. Sokol means falcon - symbol of freedom, strength, speed.

To escape continued domination, waves of Czechs left their homes for America. Many of them came to Cleveland. Here, in 1865, they formed a second Sokol in America.

Today Sokol means physical fitness . . . concerts, heritage exhibits - family activities held several nights a week. Friends made at Sokol are friends for a lifetime in old-country tradition.

The physical fitness focus is on daring gymnastic performance. Physical and moral perfection, combined with patriotism, democracy and progress.

These gymnastic workouts at Sokol bring the youngster who can hardly pronounce "Czechoslovakia" together with the great-grandbabička who remembers. "In Prague, back in 1912, long before you were born, there was a magnificent precision gymnastic exhibition - 13,000 people moving in absolute unison! I remember one performance where they formed themselves into an absolutely straight line." Among these 13,000 were 30 Sokol members who had traveled all the way from Cleveland to participate.

Sokol classes divide into groups so members can proceed at their own speed and skill. Sokol is not intended to cultivate stars, but a budding Nadia Comaneci is quickly spotted and encouraged. All Sokol children are taught on Olympic-size equipment, and dream of Olympic perfection.

There are two Sokols in Cleveland, one meeting in the historic Bohemian National Hall at 4939 Broadway; the other in a hall on Harvard Ave. The big local event held every four years is the summer exhibition, Slet, which means gathering place of the falcons. This year it's June 7th; non-falcons and public welcome. Over 500 gymnasts work out here in Cleveland - some 200 of them enter the Sokol Roundup in the Texas Astrodome later in June to compete against entries from 10,000 other Sokols around the country.

In 1977, the roundup turned out two Olympic gymnasts.

Some out-of-town sociologists miss the fact that Cleveland is not always a melting pot. In Cleveland, you can maintain a heritage. So Czech parents put their kids into Sokol at a very early age - not just for gymnastics or to push them toward the Olympics. As Sokol leader Betty Hosticka explains, "They also learn what it is to be Czech."

## ASO Executive Board Meeting

Regular meeting of the American Sokol Organization Executive Board was brought to order by President Roy Zitny, at 7:45 p.m. District minutes received were reviewed: Southern, April 23rd; Central, May 27th and Slet Committee meeting, June 10th.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** Greetings from Switzerland for our XV National Slet. Bill for dues to the Cermak Road Business Assn., \$35.00 passed for payment. Western District, asking us to provide a list of past officers to them, this will be done after the Slet.

**WOMEN'S DIRECTOR - Sis. Marie Ptacek:** Sis. Val Kudrnovsky wrote saying she is deeply honored that Bro. Kudrnovsky's calisthenics have been chosen to be used for the seniors at the XV Slet. She's very sorry, but is unable to attend. Many problems arose from our ASO tournament rule dealing with underage juniors entering only in the intermediate and high divisions. Paul and I felt like some decision had to be made. We

decided that "if the underage person has been a member of the junior class since the first of the year, he or she may compete in the low division". Response to the survey sheets was not the best, so a true picture of the number of drillers is not available right now. Sis. Georgia Drobny, Sokol Greater Cleveland, phoned cancelling one of the applicants for the Advance course. Also needed a replacement for one of her judges. Asked why the rated judges were not notified; informed her that these names were sent to Sis. Dolores Vrla of the Southern District who is handling the Championship assignments. Bro. Walter Hosek will narrate the junior calisthenics. We still have to find someone to narrate the senior calisthenics. A 40'x40' floor ex pad will be used for the modern rhythmic gymnastics competition. Competition entries: Jr. girls, Low B, 101; Low A, 145; Intermediate, 71; High Division, 11; Championship, 12; total Jr. girls competing, 340. Women's Master, 26; Low B, 38; Low A, 22; Intermediate, 46; High Division, 10; Championship, 5; women competing, 147. Staggered time schedules have been sent to the junior girls Low B and Low A divisions. There will be two sets of apparatus available in each gym and may be used for warm-ups, except for a floor ex mat (one only in each gym). There is a total of 148 participants and 18 instructors in the Special Number competition. All district flags will be carried in the opening ceremony at the Special Number Competition. Unit flags or participating units only. Only Gate 6 will be open for the Special Number Competition rehearsal and program. The competition will be held in the arena portion of the convention center, measures 110'x85', deep. Passes will be distributed to the participants, judges, tabulators and instructors. Judy Harlan and Jim Hantak have worked out volleyball schedules, starting times and a set of rules have been sent to each unit with teams entered. Will be a double elimination tournament, 8 minutes or 11 points, whichever comes first. Clock will be stopped on all timeouts and out-of-bounds balls. Judy will purchase 5 volleyballs for the tournament. Four will be presented to the winning teams, 5th will remain property of the ASO BOI. There is a total of 11 competitors in the MRG, all will compete on Thursday. Judging assignments for this competition have been sent. Sis. Pistorius will make a cassette for it. Sis. Zdenek has straightened out the problem with the cardas music. The Dallas Czech Concert Orchestra will be playing the marches, anthems and cardas. Slet rehearsal, Saturday, June 27th, 8:30 a.m., symmetry; 9:00 a.m., junior calisthenics; 9:30 a.m. senior calisthenics; 10:00 a.m. folk dance; 10:30 a.m. apparatus walk-on; 10:30 a.m. I and II class calisthenics. **DIRECTORS CONFERENCE:** Sister Leilani Sain has reserved rooms at the Lord Baltimore Hotel for the weekend of Oct. 15, 16 and 17. Program Books: Tickets to the Victory Dance and the program books will be given to every competitor, after some discussion, seems like the best time to give them is after the competitor's division is completed. There are 37 applicants for the two-week course and 22 for the one-week course.

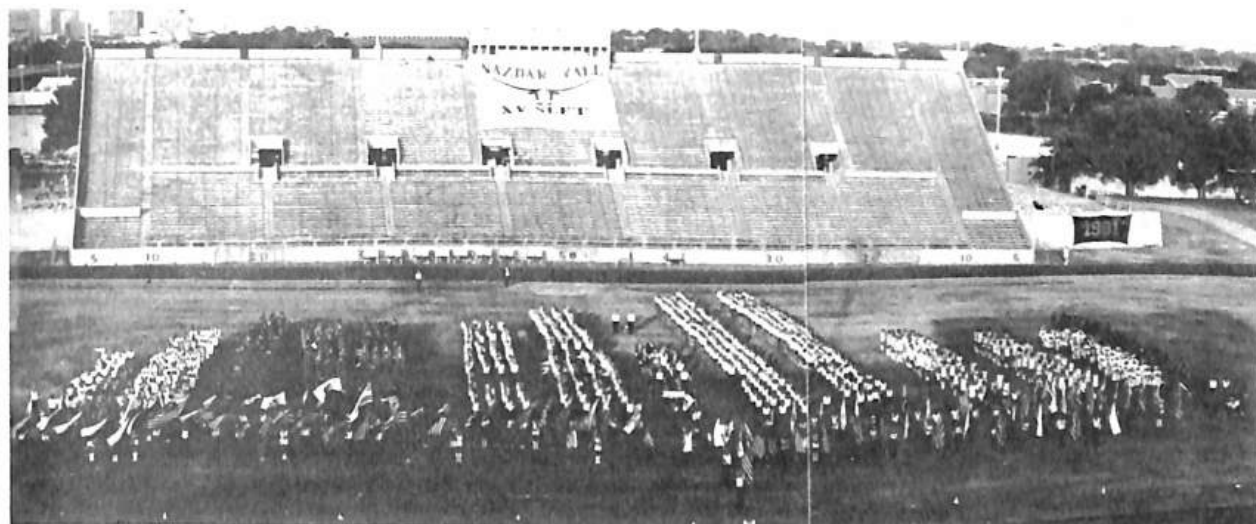

## French Honor Masaryk

The Paris Mint, official State Mint of France, has made available a reissue of a medal of 1950 issued in honor of the 100th year of the birth of President Masaryk.

The medal was designed and engraved by Lucien Bazor, responsible for most coins of France between 1930 and 1958, and considered the best artist of the Mint. On the face, the profile of T. G. Masaryk, President of the Republic of Czechoslovakia. On the reverse, a torch coasts its light on two words: VERITAS VINCIT, "Truth will win" in Latin. In the center, the coat of arms of Czechoslovakia, with the Czech words PRAVDA VITEZI (Truth will win).

The medal has a diameter of 68 millimeters, 2 5/8 inches. It is available in sterling silver (.925) for \$353 and for \$36 in bronze. Please allow six weeks for delivery. The distribution in the United States is International Government Trading Corporation (IGTC), 575 Madison Avenue, New York, NY 10022. IGTC is a subscription agent for coins and medals issued by various countries, including France.





## Next Year Plan to Attend a Great Sokol Slet in Vienna, Austria

This Slet will commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the first ever Sokol Slet held in Prague in 1882 as well as the 150th Anniversary of the founder of Sokol, Dr. Miroslav Tyrš.

Next year's Slet will be attended by Sokols from many countries of the Free World. In addition, members of several cultural, fraternal, sports and political organizations will also convene some of their meetings and other events in Vienna at that time. Thus the Slet in Vienna will bring together Sokols and Czechs and Slovaks from around the world.

Calisthenics for the Vienna Slet will be available to all interested Sokol units and lodges from ASO or Sokol USA head offices - Compulsory exercises for gymnastics competitions in Vienna will be identical to those used at the XV. American Sokol Slet in Fort Worth.
