Thank you ltr from Sokol Berwyn for support of 75th banquet, ltr from Pacific Dist. re Sokol Seattle expulsion, Statue of Liberty newsletter re: we should be listed in May issue acknowledging our donation; Sokol Minnesota newsletter article re. \$5,000.00 in donations within five minutes during last meeting. Congratulations!

DIRECTOR OF WOMEN: Sis. Sylvia Pistorius — Calisthenics and apparatus routines will be in book form and ready for distribution by the beginning of 1987 season. Cancelled special number for Zurich due to under 50 participants. Br. Michalek presented white Tee shirt w/“Sokol Instructor” in blue which could be stocked in uniform dept. Arrangements for Dist. Dir. Conf. in order. Br. Dave and Sis. Judy Harlan will write 1989 Senior calisthenics. Certification of all instructors will be a necessity soon because of insurance restrictions.

DIRECTOR OF MEN: Br. Richard Ptacek — Report on Zurich Slet details; National AAU Convention Sept. 3-7th New Orleans.

MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN: Br. Fred Kala — Membership report to be sent to all district presidents along with a 5 year comparison chart. Strong need for quarterly reports to be sent in promptly.

A USAIGC LIABILITY INSURANCE UP-DATE

(This Liability Insurance Up-date has been abstracted from articles taken from: "The Kiplinger Washington letter", "Association Digest", and the "Young Children" magazine.)

Although there already has been a little publicity about the cost of insurance going up, the tightening insurance market publicized to date is only the tip of the iceberg.

The first, and probably major factor for this dilemma, is the cyclical nature of the insurance business. For reasons beyond the scope of imagination, this overly competitive or "soft" insurance market lasted longer, and generated vaster underwriting losses, than anyone anticipated.

In 1984 the insurance industry sustained underwriting losses of \$21.3 billion as against net investment income of \$17.6 billion, for a net operating loss of over \$3.7 billion. In short, 1984 was a really horrible year in the property/casualty insurance business, and 1985 is likely to be as bad. The magnitude of insurance losses suffered in the past two years is unprecedented. It is logical to assume that the insurance market will remain very tight for the next several years. **IN SUM, THE STATE OF THE PROPERTY/CASUALTY INSURANCE INDUSTRY TODAY IS TERRIBLE.**

There are no quick fixes in sight. Kiplinger feels that the rate will finally flatten out in about 18 months. Limits on injury and damage awards will be imposed in some states, but opposition is stiff to changes restricting lawyers' contingency fees, capping pain and suffering awards, halting "frivolous" class-action suits reducing prejudgment interest rates. Trial lawyers will fight reforms.

The question is, "How did this all come about?" Well, there have definitely been bloated awards brought on by aggressive lawyers, greedy clients, and good hearted juries.

The insurance crunch is widespread and even threatens to heat up inflation. Business insurance worries probably have you climbing the wall. Premium increases are horrendous... unaffordable for many firms. Doubling and tripling of rates is common. Some jumping 1,000%. Or no coverage available at all... companies and entire industries dropped as to risky. **It is entirely possible that the ability to buy insurance in some of these areas — at any price — may be substantially impaired.**

The result of being faced with no insurance carried or budget-breaking rate increases is to make some difficult trade-offs, depending on the income bracket of the families served.

Some programs may decide to operate without insurance. This is unwise, for then the burden of paying legal fees to defend oneself against lawsuit would be in the hands of the owner/operator. This doesn't even consider mentioning the hardship that would be placed on oneself if a jury were to award

on behalf of the plaintiff and against the club. Clubs serving parents who are able and willing to pay more for their child's training may pass the premium hikes on to the parents. Clubs that are underfunded or serve low income families would have no option except to cut program quality or to close down.

Another alternative would be to eliminate all competitive programs from the club and cater only to the recreational class children, where the incidence of injury is almost non-existent.

Meanwhile, these ideas:

1. Document your program's entire insurance history. Note the name of your carrier, the type and extent of coverage, the premiums, and any claims filed and paid. In addition, document any recent changes in your insurance policy and the measures you have taken to obtain affordable insurance with adequate coverage.

2. Adopt and document measures to reduce your level of risk.

- a. Use systematic and careful screening methods to hire employees. Set up probationary periods for new staff.

- b. Keep your child/staff ratios as low as possible.

- c. Prepare writing operating procedures, policies, and personnel requirements.

- d. Ensure that all staff participate in a gymnastics certification training program that offers sessions on coaching and instructing children, safety, and first aid.

- e. Allow parent observation areas.

- f. Develop a stringent system to supervise all staff.

- g. Document how the physical safety of children is protected in your program: staff first aid training, display certification certificates, collaboration with medical practitioners, and labeling of all equipment with safety warnings.

- h. Be sure that all children and parents view the film, "WARNING... IT COULD HAPPEN TO YOU" and sign the appropriate documents and releases.

- i. Immediately report all accidents to your insurance agent by written form.

3. Inform your insurance agent/company about your experiences, options, and likely responses at every step from your first receipt of a nonrenewal or rate increase. Send them copies of all letters you write. Send them a copy of your program's insurance history and regular up-dates to reflect your efforts to obtain or retain insurance.

4. Plan ahead — start several months before your insurance renewal date, so you will not be left without coverage.
