Minutes of the February 23, 1993
meeting of the A.S.O. Executive Board

The meeting was called to order by President Borvansky at 7:35 p.m. and the pledge to the flag was recited. Members present were Bros. Borvansky, Babka, Lebloch and Sis. Pros, Kourim, Pajeau, Satek and Jurew in the office and Bros. Masek, Dalton, Milan, Kalat and Podhrasky and Sis. Kalat and Dalton on teleconference. Excused were Bro. Michalek and Sis. Wojcik and Sedlacek.

Sis. Pros moved to accept minutes of the January meeting with spelling errors corrected and cost of school being \$400, seconded and passed. The Northeastern District January minutes and the Director's Newsletter have been received and will be filed in the office. Invitation from Judy Baar Topinka for her annual Polka Party. Bro. Babka moved to support this event, seconded and passed. Received tax bill on property we sold in Seattle. Bro. Babka moved to contact Bro. Riha, the lawyer that handled the sale and look into why we are still getting the tax bill, seconded and passed.

Bro. Slavik sent a letter about COS gymnasts coming for the Slet. Sis. Kourim met with a group from Prague that would like to have 180 gymnasts come to the Slet. They are looking for inexpensive housing and food Bro. Borvansky will call Bro. Slavik and try to work out details. Bro. Podhrasky reminded board to have everything in writing.

Sis. Kalat gave the BOI report. Bro. Babka moved to accept final report form from the Central District for

\$74.40 for rhythmic materials, seconded and passed. Bro. Masek moved that the Gymnast editor purchase five magazine binders for copies of the International Gymnast magazine at a cost of about \$30, seconded and passed. The BOI will have Bro. Benak and Sis. Panackia meet in the Chicago area in March to prepare for the National Instructor's School to be held after the Slet. They will contact the COS to have instructors come to the area to teach the 1994 Prague Calisthenics after our Slet. Continuing to answer questions about the Slet activities. The BOI hopes that some of the donated money from the McDonald Corp. will be used for the school and for trophies. Bro. Babka moved to approve the BOI report, seconded and passed.

Membership, no report. Sis. Wojcik, Treasurer, no report. Bro. Masek, 2nd Vice-President, no report. Sis. Kourim, 1st Vice-President, no report.

Bro. Lebloch reported that the Educational Committee has met and is offering their services if the Kolin Kmoch Brass Band comes to perform during the Slet week. They will help Sis. Basta and Bro. Rabas. The committee will also help with material for the Program book. The committee will obtain judges for the Slet Art Contest. The certificate given to the ASO from the COS will be translated. An open house will be held at the library in the National Office the week of April 18-24, 1993, which is National Library Week. Took care of correspondence and prepared articles for the publication. Bro. Lebloch moved to subscribe to the COS publications

for a cost of \$41, seconded and passed.

Bro. Milan reported he was in the Czech Republic for the World Sokol meeting. Recommend that we accept the World Sokol Federation and write a letter to the COOS. He visited Florida and did both of the calisthenics with the group at Sokol Miami. Attended meeting about Ray Kroc award.

Sis. Dalton moved that if Bro. Slavik has not sent a letter, we should send one with apologies for delay and accept membership in the World Sokol Federations, seconded and passed with three opposed because we do not know fee at this time. Bro. Milan though fee would be about \$100 per year.

Sis. Satek reported that the February issue is in the mail and the March issue is at the printer. The March issue will have the rosters that have been sent to the office, art contest and souvenir information. The April issue will have the banquet information, ticket information and a page that each unit will have permission to duplicate and pass out to their classes with Slet information.

The auditing report was read and approved. Sis. Pros. took care of Sokol Taylor of Taylor, TX, as your newest unit. Bro. Kalat moved to accept Sokol Taylor assigned to the Southern District as unit #96 of the American Sokol Organization, seconded and passed. A charter needs to be sent to Sokol Taylor.

Bro. Borvansky attended meeting about Ray Kroc award.

Sis. Filipello led a discussion about

fund raising. Bro. Milan moved that we dissolve all ties with the John Hancock Insurance Company of Omaha and their agents since the company is no longer based in Omaha, seconded and passed. Sis. Filipello suggested that we have written guidelines for fund raising ideas. The \$5,000 from the McDonald Corporation will be split between Slet expenses and the National Instructor's School expenses. Bro. Babka moved that we split the donation from McDonald Corporation as Sis. Filipello suggested, seconded and passed.

Sis. Kourim reported that there is still no signature on the contract with Naperville Central High School, Morton High School and Comput-

A-Sport contracts are fine. Over 600 letters have been sent out for ads in the program book. A large mailing for well wishers, benefactors, etc., also went out. The Slet Committee recommended a \$48 fee for the banquet. Bro. Lebloch moved to approve \$48 fee for banquet, seconded and approved. Letter for trophy fund will be going out about March 1, 1993. Souvenirs are selling at a good rate, there are 24 people interested in golf and 12 for bowling.

A long discussion about the Kolin Kmoch Brass Band coming for the Slet. Cost would be about \$15,000-\$20,000. Bro. Lebloch moved to contact the Kmoch Band for a concert and Slet performance, seconded and passed. The

Educational Committee will help.

Bro. Kalat moved to give current directors a director's pin, making 11 total pins at the opening ceremonies, seconded and passed.

Bro. Babka discussed what the By-Laws state about two units merging. Sokol Slavsky is thinking of merging with another unit. Bro. Kalat moved to not temporarily put members in T.G. Masaryk, seconded and passed with two opposed.

Bro. Michalek asked if there will be an all Sokol forum or roundtable after the Slet. This will be looked into.

Minutes of the March 23, 1993 meeting
of the A.S.O. Executive Board

The meeting was called to order by President Borvansky at 7:35 p.m. and the pledge to the flag was recited. Members present were Bros. Borvansky, Lebloch and Sis. Pros, Kourim, Pajeau, Satek, Filipello, Sedlacek and Jurew in the office and Bros. Masek, Dalton, Milan, Kalat and Podhrasky and Sis. Kalat and Dalton on teleconference. Sis. Wojcik and Bros. Satek and Babka were excused. Minutes will be read at next month's meeting.

The March District Director's Newsletter, Central District February minutes and Sokol Omaha minutes have been received in the office and will be kept on file. Letter from a company selling wines from southern Moravia. Letter from Sokol West Suburban explaining a member who will have dual membership with Sokol Tabor and Sokol West Suburban, but will only vote at Sokol West Suburban. Numerous other letters that were taken care of and letters were sent out in reply. To Bro. Riha regarding paying taxes for property in Seattle and his reply that he is in contact with the people in Seattle. Also, sent letter to COS agreeing to By-Laws.

Sis. Kalat sent a written report which she read over the phone. The BOI has sent a welcome to Sokol Taylor in Taylor, Texas. Bro. Lebloch moved to send them complimentary packets for Tots, Girls and Boys Skills programs, seconded and passed. Had Bro. Benak from Omaha and Sis. Panackia of Detroit

come for a weekend to the Chicago area to plan for the 1993 National Instructor's School. The course fee remains at \$400 with a mini course being offered in the evenings. There is no new information about the 1994 Prague Calisthenics Clinic. Work has been progressing on the 1993 Slet. The Sokol Manual should be ready for the course. Bro. Lebloch moved to order 10 hard bound copies for the library and archives, seconded and passed with one opposed.

Discussion about taping the events of the 1993 Slet. Bro. Michalek and Sis. Kalat will prepare a proposal to the Cable TV station in Naperville to have their volunteers film our events.

Sis. Sedlacek presented a written membership report. In 1992 we lost a total of 169 members. There were some units that did have gains in membership. At the Slet, certificates can be awarded to the units that have had an increase in membership.

Bro. Lebloch reported for the Educational Committee. He received a thank you from church in Pennsylvania that requested music and word translation of a Husite Hymn. Reviewed Czech correspondence and took appropriate action. Submitted articles for the publication.

Bro. Milan reported that the people in Texas are working on the banners for the participant's flags. Bro. Waldauf reported that Bro. Uher died. A letter will be sent to his wife.

Sis. Satek reported that April issue will be twenty pages and it will be devoted to the Slet. It will be the 100th anniversary of a Slet in the

United States.

Sis. Pros reported that all bills have been paid as received. Continuing to send out mailings for the Slet. Many people have been coming into the office to help. Met with the people at the Marriott to confirm required space. We must have more people rent rooms, so that we are not charged to use the extra space requirements that we need.

Treasurer, Sis. Wojcik, excused. Sis. Kourim had no report.

Bro. Masek reported that the Foundation Fund is still looking for another member on their board. They continue to investigate different ways of raising money for the fund. He requested Bro. Borvansky or a representative of the ASO Executive Board to come to St. Paul, MN for the Western District Slet on June 11-13, 1993.

Bro. Borvansky reported that he took part in both Sokol Stickney's and Sokol Slavsky's exhibitions and took care of routine business in the office.

Sis. Filipello, as Central District Women's Director and Executive Director of the ASO, went to Sokol Milwaukee with Sis. Kalat. Sis. Kalat went with Sis. Filipello to Naperville Central High School to check facilities. Sis. Filipello wrote an article about Sokol for Modern Maturity and has been working on the Ray Kroc Award. The Cermak Road Business Association will be taking the backpage of the Souvenir Book for \$300.

Bro. Podhrasky stated that the By-Laws for Sokol Detroit are accepted and moved that the board accept

Discussion about the gymnasts coming from Prague and representing the COS. Sokol Berwyn and Sokol Brookfield have agreed to house the gymnasts. Southern and Eastern Districts have agreed to help defray the cost of feeding and transporting the gymnasts. There is a possibility of 180 additional gymnasts, of which 23 could pay their own way. and Bro. Borvansky form a committee with Bro. Zitny, Bro. Kala and Bro. Slavik to discuss the gymnasts coming from Europe and the problems that might develop, seconded and passed with two opposed.

The Denni Hlasatel would like to do a 4-page spread about the Slet. The board approved the souvenirs and the prices that the Slet Committee presented.

Sis. Jurew is looking for locations of all the statues in the Chicagoland area that are Czech-related. She will have information at the

hospitality center at the Slet headquarters.

Bro. Rabas, Sis. Basta and Bro. Lebloch are working on the Czech Brass Band coming for the Slet. They will come from Toronto and be housed at the site of the National School. The concert will be on Thursday evening and they will play for the Slet on Sunday. They will be give \$50 each spending money. A few members of the band will be asked to play after the Slet Awards Ceremony on Saturday evening.

Minutes of the April 27, 1993 meeting of
the A.S.O. Executive Board

Pros, Kourim, Jurew, Pajeau, Satek and Filipello in the office and Bros. Masek, Dalton, Milan, Kalat and Podhrasky and Sis. Kalat and Dalton on teleconference. Members excused were Sis. Wojcik and Sedlacek.
